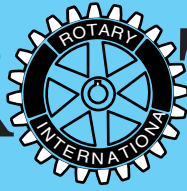

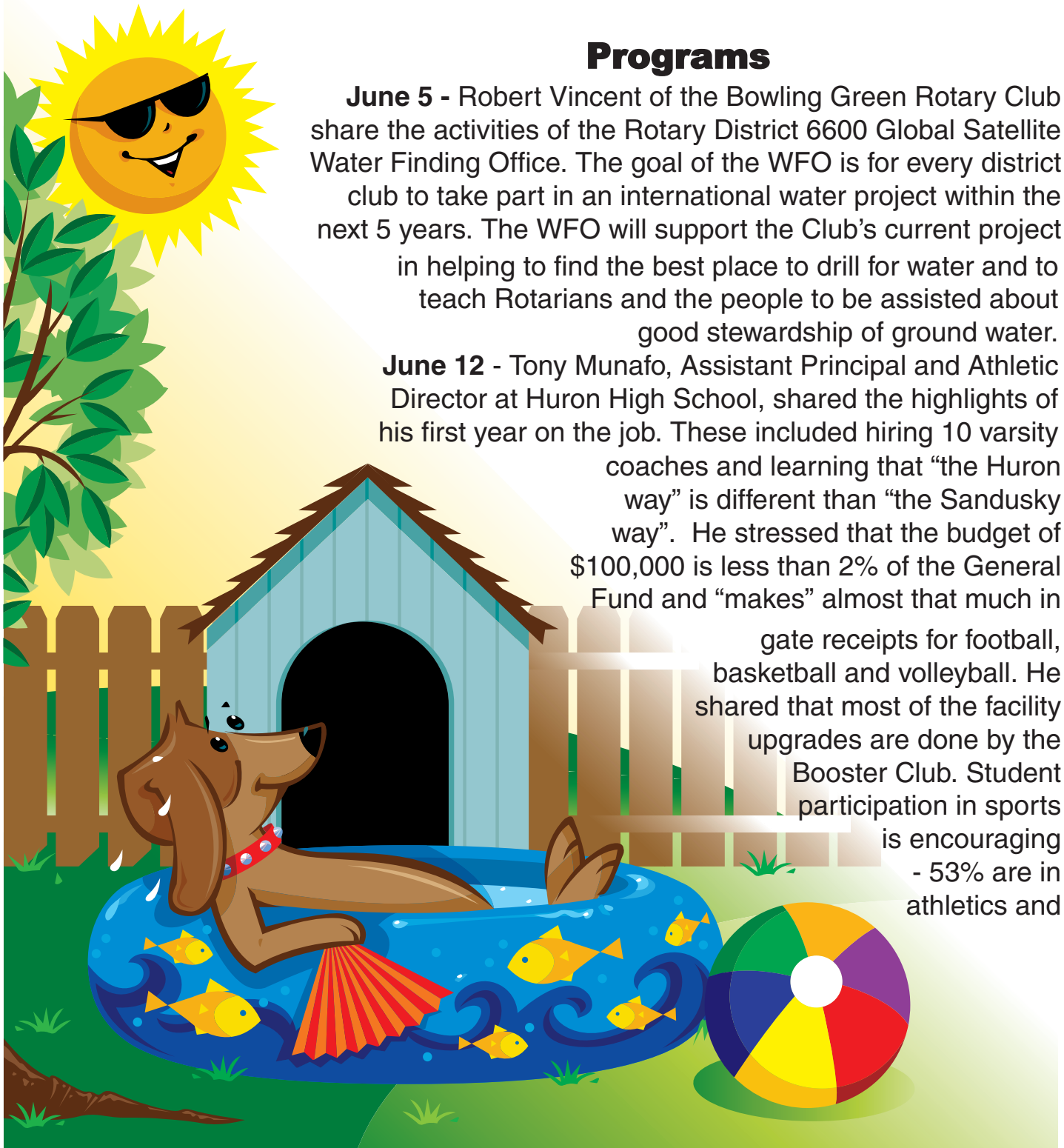

Programs

June 5 - Robert Vincent of the Bowling Green Rotary Club share the activities of the Rotary District 6600 Global Satellite Water Finding Office. The goal of the WFO is for every district club to take part in an international water project within the next 5 years. The WFO will support the Club's current project in helping to find the best place to drill for water and to teach Rotarians and the people to be assisted about good stewardship of ground water.

June 12 - Tony Munafo, Assistant Principal and Athletic Director at Huron High School, shared the highlights of his first year on the job. These included hiring 10 varsity coaches and learning that "the Huron way" is different than "the Sandusky way". He stressed that the budget of \$100,000 is less than 2% of the General Fund and "makes" almost that much in

gate receipts for football, basketball and volleyball. He shared that most of the facility upgrades are done by the Booster Club. Student participation in sports is encouraging - 53% are in athletics and



108 of the 149 students with 3.5 or better GPA are athletes.

June 19 - Rotarian Bill Hess, sporting a UM tie, answered the burning question: "how did any Ohio boy go to the school up north?" In a wonderfully entertaining talk, Bill described going to the school up north for aeronautical engineering and later to law school. Bill told of meeting his lovely wife Esther and deciding to move to Huron. Club members await a return visit for more tales from Bill, a born storyteller.

June 26 - The Club installation dinner was held at Marconi's. Rotarians and spouses enjoyed fellowship and socializing as the new Board members and officers present were installed. Outgoing President Dave thanked outgoing Board members Julie and Steve. President Doug presented Dave with a Rotary jacket thanking him on behalf of the club for his year as President.

Pres. Doug presented 2007-08 "Rotary Shares" pins for members to wear weekly and shared his vision for his year: create strong club membership through rejuvenation by re-understanding Huron Rotary.
