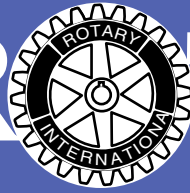

Programs

Donations from PHF go toward "points" that translate to funding for local activities and help in applications for mathing funds for International projects sponsored by the Club.
