**Speaker and Topic:** Vicki Kaszonyi: EHOVE update

**Program highlights:** Ms Kaszonyi, head of the EHOVE adult career center, showed a brief film, the first half produced by students. The students listed 10 reasons they go to EHOVE, which stands of Erie Huron Ottawa Vocational Education. Following the film, Ms Kaszonyi explained the various programs that the school offers. Included were several new programs spanning several fields, including Trade Industry, Publish Safety, Culinary Arts, Marine trades, and various health fields. There is also a growing focus on Green science technology. The Tech Prep students are those who are also taking college courses at BGSU-Firelands. The tech-prep mission is to merge vocational training with academics to open up the opportunity for students to attend college and get a degree. EHOVE is now 40 years old and draws from an 800 square mile area. Its enrollment is up 18% this year.

**Speaker and Topic:** Bill Monahan, Pat Shenigo: Upcoming Erie Co. projects

**Program highlights:** Bill M started the program listing a number of projects planned for Erie County: [1] NASA runway project; [2] Rte 250 sewer project, from Kahahari to the turnpike; [3] working with Kalahari to double the size of its footprint to make it the largest water park in the North America; [4] a commuter rail to come from Cleveland to end in Sandusky (5-7 years out); [5] Landfill gas project. Gas is now being captured for use in creating electricity. The county will earn carbon credits for this; [6] The Census, now complete, shows a loss of between 2500 and 3000 people in Erie Co., most coming from Sandusky area. This will affect state tax income. [7] Completion of mutual regional law enforcement dispatch for Sandusky and Perkins. This office now offers dispatch services to the Huron PD at night.

Shenigo continued the program focusing only on the NASA runway project. It's purpose will be to fly in (about 20 flights a year) major cargo, such as totally assembled space satellites for full scale testing, including decibel and wind testing. This will be the largest functioning aerospace facility of its kind in the world. Major players in space technology from all over the world are planning to use this facility and bring many (up to 1,500) jobs to the area.

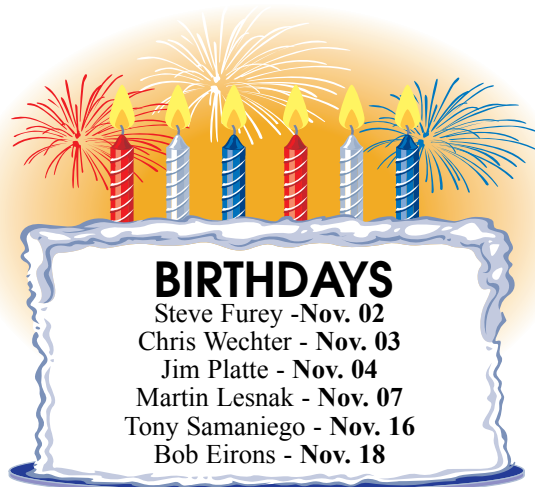
